Join the arranger Certification Program (ACP)!

** Available to members and non-member directors only

** Successful completion of the entire program results in becoming CMA

(Certified Music Arranger)

** Cost = \$100.00. No expiration. Ok to stop and start as needed

The Five Levels of the ACP:

Beginner

Self-study based on the Arranger's Guide, available from SAI, hard copy only, \$25.00 members' price. Nine units, each with a test. Unit tests must be passed in order and are administered by the Regional ACP coordinator.

Bridge Project

Relatively new level designed to provide practical arranging experience to people who successfully complete the Beginner level. Groups of up to 3 are tutored by an Approved Arranger (ACP participant who has successfully completed the Intermediate level). Groups meet monthly via Zoom to compare/ review their basic arrangements of assigned songs. This level takes about one year to complete.

Enrichment Project

Scholarship level

Linda Olding ACP Coordinator Region 19 <u>olding2@comcast.net</u> The "cohort level". Cohorts consist of five or six participants, from all over the country and even the world, who have completed the Bridge Project level. A defined curriculum is taught by a pair of CMAs, with monthly Zoom meetings Successful completion results in becoming an Approved Arranger (AA). This level takes 15-18 months to complete.

Similar to the Bridge Project, but with somewhat more challenging songs. Small groups of Approved Arrangers meet via Zoom to compare their arrangements of these songs. This level is un-mentored, but CMAs are available to answer questions as needed. It's also self-paced and optional.

Participants must qualify by submitting three arrangements for review. The arrangements are each scored by three different CMA reviewers who have been trained to evaluate them in a standardized manner. The average of the nine scores must exceed a certain cutoff for the applicant to receive a scholarship. The scholarship money is used to compensate mentor CMAs who work intensively and one-on-one with the participants for one year at a time. Scholarship recipients must re-qualify for a second year, which is with a different CMA mentor. Upon successful completion of two years, they become Certified Music Arrangers (CMAs).
