

EVENTS UPDATE

This year's convention theme is "Together wherever we go" Indeed, with COVID infections and restrictions lessening, we hope to see everyone back TOGETHER for a fun convention in Lancaster, PA on May 17-21. As you have probably seen from our periodic emails to all members, this year we have changed things a bit to offer more. The quartet and chorus briefings, an award ceremony celebrating our members' achievements, and a social hour for all will be on Thursday Night. Two classes and a mass sing rehearsal are on Friday morning; and of course, the quartet and chorus contests are as normal on Friday evening and Saturday day followed by the Show of Champions and afterglow Saturday night. We are staying in the Lancaster Marriott at Penn Square which is connected to the convention center. You will be making your own room reservations here: https://www.marriott.com/event-reservations/reservation-link.mi?id=1669666844350&key=GRP&app=resvlink

There have been a few problems with the reservation system, so please read the updates below

- There are several room types available. Kings, Kings with Sofa bed, Exec Corner room (a Larger King with a little more elbow room), Double Queens and Double Doubles. These are all \$149/night. Two free parking spaces are included with each room.
- Regarding room type, handicap accessibility, and proximity to their chorus, folks can note that request
 in the "Any Special Requests or Needs" field under either the "Choose Room Features" or "Room
 Accessibility & Bed Type" sections. The hotel will try their best to honor these requests, but they can
 not be guaranteed.
- Secondly, there is not an option to list 4 people in a room. If you want to pile 4 friends together you'll need to add the 4th in the "Special Requests or Needs" field.
- We currently only have 3 standard rooms in the contract for Wednesday night. They are booked already so if anyone else tries for Wednesday it will say no availability. If indeed we need more rooms for Wednesday I will extend the block, but folks should contact me, Sally Kelly sakhcmc61@gmail.com
- Finally, April 26 is the cut off date for making your room reservations in our block at the group rate of \$149/night.

Also, in addition to the regional Afterglow, there are a few meeting rooms we are making available to choruses who might want their own gathering space Saturday night. Please contact Sally Kelly sakhcmc61@gmail.com if your chorus is interested.

COMMUNICATIONS CORNER

Spring is almost here, and among other things that means that our chapters should be holding their annual meetings and elections in the next couple months! This also means that it is time to update your chorus' entry in the Region 19 Directory!

The Directory is a living document that contains the contact information for the RMT, Regional Committees, and all of our Chapter leaders. It is important that you help us keep this up to date so that you and your chorus do not miss important information. The link to the Regional Directory can be found in the Members Only section of our website (to protect the privacy of our leaders). You are not automatically registered to the Members Only section, so if you have not accessed that before you will need to click the "Register" button and be approved before you gain access.

If you have already registered:

- Click the "login" button to access the information.
- On the first page you will see a list of links click on "Communications". The first item on the Communications page is the Regional Directory.
- Click on the word "link" and it will take you to a Google Document.

You will have the ability to suggest changes and comment, so type in your changes and it will highlight the former information being removed with a strikethrough and the new information will be underlined. Both of these types of changes will appear in a different color as well. You may also choose to add a comment that contains the updated information. Our Regional Directory Editor will be notified of these updates and will then accept them.

If you have any questions or have trouble with this process, reach out to Nikki Burkhardt (saireg19communications@gmail.com) or your RMT liaison with questions. Remember that changes can be made at any time as well, so if roles change mid-year you can also update them at that time using the same process. The region held a workshop in Wilmington, Delaware on Saturday, March 4, 2023. The day was designed especially for needs of the Small Choruses. A full-day of workshops was taught by Jennifer Williams, Master Director of the Dundalk Chorus. Jennifer offered sessions in Visual Communications, Vocal Skills, You Be the Judge, and Does Riser Placement Matter. Diamond State Chorus served as the Demo Chorus for the session on Riser Placement. Jennifer also met with Directors and Musical Leaders to lead a discussion on Choosing Music. And of course we couldn't go without a little Tag Singing led by Linda Beaver. Eleven choruses from Region 19 were represented at the event.












THE VOICES NOVICE QUARTET COMPETITION *** CALLING ALL NEW AND NOT SO NEW QUARTETS ***

Has your quartet ever had the "itch" to compete in the regional quartet contest – but you hesitate because you feel you are not quite ready? Do you wish there was a venue where you could get your competition 'feet' wet before you entered the real deal in the Spring?

Well Region 19 has the **perfect** opportunity for you!

Region 19 is bringing back "The Voices" competition at FLASH 2023. In 2014, we reimagined the original Novice Quartet Contest. We wanted to provide an opportunity for new quartets to compete, but also wanted to



provide them with some tools and coaching to help them succeed. Thus, 'The Voices' was born!

In a nutshell, a Novice Quartet is defined as a quartet where no more than two members have ever competed in a Regional Quartet Contest. Quartets who fit this requirement can apply to compete with two contestable songs at FLASH on Friday evening, October 6, 2023. Applications are due on May 26, 2023 and will be forthcoming. However, the exciting twist is that each quartet will be paired with at least one member of the Silver Sorority, the Region 19 organization of Quartet Champions, who will provide, free of charge, a total of three 2.5 hour coaching sessions, to assist the quartet in preparing for the upcoming "The Voices" competition.

We have had three "The Voices" contests in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The winners of those contests, JewelTones, 2nd Star and Starling 4, respectively, are currently all still together as quartets. Comments from many participating quartets feel the experience and associated coaching was invaluable in their singing and quartet development.

As far as the competition, the winner of the contest is eligible for reimbursement for their Regional Quartet Contest registration, should they choose to compete in the Spring following "The Voices" competition. The other quartets in the contest will receive constructive comments to help them improve as a quartet but will not receive placements or scores. There will be four judges, one in each of the four categories.
