BACK TO REHERSAL

Masks or No Masks? Vaccines? Inside or Outside?



Last week we all received an email from Sweet Adelines International to remind us that the health and safety of our singers continues to be the top priority of SAI but acknowledges that many choruses and quartets are considering what the transition back to in-person rehearsals might look like.

The discussions and decisions are deeply personal and more importantly, driven by local guidelines and regulations which vary from city to city, region to region, and country to country. SAI is not recommending that choruses go ahead and meet in person but rather that each chapter follows local regulations and the concerns of their membership as they plan for the future.

SAI has compiled resources to assist each chorus and quartet if and when they begin to transition back to inperson rehearsals. The resources include recommendations to decrease risk of COVID-19 exposure and transmission; however, these recommendations do not eliminate the risks. SAI asks that singers respect the comfort level and boundaries of those who make the decision to attend in-person rehearsals as we continue to cope and grow in our understanding and navigate these unprecedented times.

Headquarters has suggested that each chorus establish a Back to Rehearsal Planning Team that will review the resources provided on the International Website as well as materials that are being compiled at the regional level that are relevant to your specific location. Each Regional Management Team will name a single point of contact, or liaison that can assist your teams as they create their plans. Here in Region 19, the Back to Rehearsal Liaison is Patty Weeks, Membership Coordinator for the RMT. Patty will be available to help with any questions that come up at the chapter level, and if needed, take the question to International for further review and advice. As information is updated, she will send that out to your chapter planning teams.

I've had such great opportunities with all the classes and training that SA has offered to all its members.

I'm still singing with the Valley Forge Chorus and we are still forging on during this terrible time under the direction of our great new director, Rich Gray.

Jam Nichols 50 Years

Pam Nichols joined the Blue Hen Chapter (then Region 15) right after finishing grad school and moving to Delaware. She was president when that chorus combined with the former Colonial Triangle Chorus to form the new chorus, Diamond State Chorus. She has sung bass except for two years when the director, Marykaye Morgan said they needed baris. She has been in several competing quartets, in both choruses, including Hear and Now (which came in second twice, third and fourth once in regional competition), Accidental Harmony and most recently, Vocal Exchange.



She was bass section leader until becoming director; and assistant director through many directors from whom she learned a great deal, she says.

On the regional level, she has been a member of the Faculty (coaching choruses and quartets), and was coordinator of Assistant Director Education for several years, lining up educational workshops for the region's assistant directors. Thanks to regional schools and chorus and quartet coaching, she says that she learned just about everything she knows about music. In 2006, she felt ready to become the director of Diamond State. Her biggest thrill, she admits, was going to International 's Harmony Classic competition in Denver in 2012 with her friends, representing Region 19's small choruses.

Sileen Warion 50 Years

My mother was a charter member of the Dundalk Chorus in 1958. One year later the chorus was lucky enough to offer a young Fred King the position of director and that jump started his career in music education and barbershop harmony.



I was 9 years old and taking piano lessons. Fred came to my house for a meeting with the Board of Directors and right away identified the song I was trying to play. That began my history with and love for the chorus. A few years later I had a small walk on part in the annual show. That sealed the deal and I finally joined the chorus the month I graduated from college.

The years that followed were so exciting and provided so many opportunities. We hosted and competed in the first International Competition and competed again in Seattle. I served as president of the chorus and traveled to Tulsa for an educational workshop which helped me grow as a teacher and leader.

I was lucky enough to sing in a quartet with three other wonderful ladies - Pat Edelman, Pat King, and Jane Biehl. Probably the best times were singing on stage with my mother. I have so many fond memories of my time singing, the friends I've made and consider myself so lucky to have had the Sweet Adeline experience help shape my adult life.

It most definitely is "Fine to be a Sweet Adeline"!

Sileen J. Fosenberg

In 1971 I joined Vienna Falls Chorus in Virginia. When we moved to Maryland, I joined Elkridge Chapter. Finding it too far to travel from Towson to chorus, I put an ad in the local Towson paper for women who like to sing. We met at my house and as we grew we moved to a church hall and became the Towson Valley Chorus. I directed Towson Valley for 28 years. During that time, we won 1st Place Small Chorus twice and Most Improved Chorus with an increase of 100 points. Towson Valley performed with Marvin Hamlisch several times at the Meyerhoff Symphony Hall, both onstage several nights and in the lobby, due to the efforts of Marlene Teitel entering us in the "Search for a Star" contest.



Towson Valley also had as many as 15 or more singing engagements every year, including the Kennedy Center on the Millennium stage. Around 2000 we merged with Elkridge to become Harbor City Music Company. A few years later I joined Pride of Baltimore. I had the exciting opportunity to compete in five International Competitions with Elkridge and Pride. I am currently a member of the Dundalk Chorus for over a year.

When TVSA merged with Elkridge, we began to have annual reunion parties every year after the merger (except for this past year because of Covid). The most memorable part of my SAI life with the Towson Valley Chorus has been getting together with all the women who had sung with us over twenty-eight years. We consider ourselves family with many enduring friendships as seen in the continued attendance at our reunions. Towson Valley was lucky enough to have our very own arranger in the chorus and we focused on Marsha Zwicker's arrangements for our singing engagements, since they were all songs the audience could recognize. We also adopted her arrangement of the Baltimore Song as our signature song, including fun props, which we sang at every performance.

The SAI regional and international competitions have provided opportunities to deepen friendships with my singing sisters and have allowed me to travel to places I never would have been able to go, including Honolulu, Calgary, Reno, Las Vegas, and New Orleans. But seeing all my Towson Valley girls at the yearly reunions continues to be the yearly highlight of my 50 years with Sweet Adelines.

Finally, Please alert your President/Team Leader and Director. They will be joining in the game play for the three teams that make it to the final round.




DIAMOND STATE CHORUS




DELMARVA
