If you're looking for a way to change up your routine, I've got a few ideas for you to consider. I'm looking for a few people to add to the Communications Team at the Regional level. These jobs are design to be lightweight and minimal burden on any one person – perfect for you if you're looking for a way to contribute to the Region without adding a whole lot of extra responsibilities to your schedule.

Here are the jobs that are available:

Tech Writer: The primary editor of the monthly Barbershop Beat email newsletter, and the editor of the Hi Los magazine each spring. This position also acts as Registrar for F.L.A.S.H., Singers' School, and any other regional educational events, not including contest. Must be a good writer and editor, proof reader, and familiar with Microsoft Word and Excel, and comfortable with graphic design concepts, or maybe just "has a good eye for design". Will begin training in January 2018, and become the primary Tech Writer in May 2018. Approximately 5 hours per month plus 10-12 hours each Spring.

Email Marketing Tool Manager: The primary manager of the regional email list in the MailChimp online email tool, conducts monthly comparisons of SAI email list against the Regional list. Must be tech-savvy and enjoy detail-oriented work such as sorting, comparing, etc. Will begin training immediately. Approximately 3-4 hours per month.

Using Social Media to Boost your Marketability Di Bartel – Region 19 Marketing Coordinator



Does your Chorus have a Facebook page? Recently I was told by a member of a chorus that they "don't use Facebook." I wondered, why would you not? Facebook is *big*, like really big! As the largest social network in the world, it has more than 1.23 billion active users, 62% of whom log in on a daily basis. Of course, we don't need to reach all 1.23 billion users, but we can



utilize the area we live, work and sing in to garner new attention, shows, sponsors and members!

It is my goal to use this space to provide a few tips each month so you can boost your Social Media Identity and draw more people to your site, your shows, and hopefully your membership!

So...Tip Number One: Start a Facebook page! @

Facebook has three tools which can be used by anyone: Pages, Ads, and Groups. Each of these options has its own purpose, and they can be combined for greater reach.

- 1. **Pages:** Facebook pages are similar to profiles, but for businesses, organizations, and public figures. Users can "Like" a page, which means they'll automatically receive updates from that page in their news feed. Users also have the option to "Like" a page but not follow it. Pages are free to set up. Pages can be liked by anyone, without a requirement for the page creator to accept a fan. They also don't have a restriction on the number of friends/fans they can have.
- 2. **Ads:** Facebook offers a fantastic targeted advertising platform. You can create ads targeted at specific geographic areas, ages, education levels, and even the types of devices used for browsing. Ads can get expensive
- 3. **Groups:** Facebook groups are similar to discussion forums, but with additional features that pages and profiles have (like a wall). You can create groups related to your industry or product offerings as a way to reach out to potential customers. Groups are free also, but groups can be very time consuming.

Facebook Pages are the simplest, easiest way to get started marketing with Facebook. They're free, relatively easy to set up, and very flexible.

Tip Number Two: Use your Facebook page! ©

Here are some more tips on using your Facebook page:

Tip #1 What's that little picture all about? - That's your profile picture! Being recognizable on Facebook is important to getting found and "Liked." Because your profile picture is at the top of your Page and used as your thumbnail for all of your posts, you need to make sure it's something that your fans will actually associate with your brand. Usually, it's best to just go with your logo.

Tip #2 Use your About section - A preview of your "about" section is shown beneath your profile picture, and it's one of the first places people will look when they're scanning your Page. Make sure yours displays relevant information about your chorus—what you are all about, your website, what times and where you rehearse – this will help answer people's questions right off the bat.

Tip #3 Post useful information to your wall - What you post to your wall will show up in the news feeds of everyone who has "Liked" your page, just as it does when you post something to your personal profile. So, make sure what you're posting is useful to your fans. Don't post endless updates about the same thing, and don't post too many updates, clogging the news feeds of your fans.

Tip #4 When is the best time to post?? - The best time of day can vary from Page to Page and audience to audience, but there has been some data released that shows that posts published between 1 - 4 p.m. have the best click-through and share rates. Use this as a jumping-off point to discover which time of day works best for you.

Tip #5 Visual content is essential to succeeding on social media - Research has a shown the use of visual content in Facebook campaigns can generate 65% more engagement after only one month. Post pictures of rehearsals, post snippets of a song, did you recently have a retreat? Why not post a video compilation of photos!

Next month – Like, Love, Share? What's that all about (and more!)

So back in the beginning of June, something cool popped up in my Facebook feed called *Sweet Adelines Rock!* It was started by the Pride of Toledo Chorus in Ohio as a way to promote Sweet Adelines and Harmony. Sweet Adelines Rock was inspired by "The Kindness Rock Project" (http://thekindnessrocksproject.com/), which has two goals: 1) to inspire others, and 2) recruit every person who stumbles upon it to join the pursuit of inspiring others through small acts of kindness!

The goal of Sweet Adelines Rock! (https://www.facebook.com/groups/sweetadelinesrock/) is to have a fun way to spread the joy of barbershop harmony and brighten someone's day! I thought, "How fun would it be to have Region 19 join in the fun as a way to promote barbershop and our choruses throughout our areas?" Maybe someone will be inspired to come to a rehearsal!

The concept is really simple: Go to Walmart, Home Depot or Lowes, and buy a bag of small river rocks (3-5 inch - \$17.00 a bag), paint them with brightly colored musical themes, and then on the back add your chorus and/or regional contact information! Seal the rock with a clear poly sealant.

The suggested verbiage for the back of the rock is:

Find us on Facebook
Sweet Adelines Rock!
Post a picture and re-hide the rock
Use my hashtag and follow me
#_____ (your chorus hashtag)
My suggestion: add www.yourchoruswebsite

Did I mention the fun times you and your chorus mates can have bonding over some wine (or drink of choice) and munchies while painting rocks??

Get to know our 50 Year Members

In 1967, after having two wonderful sons, one in 1964 and one 1966, I needed to find some adult companionship or hobby. My husband was a drummer in the Navy and also played in the evenings for extra money, and fun, which left me alone in the house a lot. My babysitter lived one block away and mentioned that her mother, Phyllis Laughlin, sang in an a Capella group of women. This group was part of Sweet Adelines who called themselves the Norfolk Chapter.

I went to visit and was hooked. I made many new friends and sang both baritone and lead. Before I left that chapter I had colored my hair red and of course we sang "Red Head" in contest.



We were transferred to Washington D.C. with the Navy Band, and I found another Sweet Adelines chapter called the Montgomery Chapter in Silver Spring, Maryland, and was happy to join them. I also joined a quartet for the first time: The Cinnamon Sounds.

My husband left the Navy, and went on the road with a very well-known trumpet player, Maynard Ferguson, and the kids and I moved to Alabama to my husband's hometown. There weren't any Sweet Adelines down there, so I started a chapter in Florence/Muscle Shoals/Sheffield area. I directed that group for a small time until we found a more qualified Director. After about a year or so, my husband was tired of being away from the family, so he rejoined the Navy ** so we packed up to go to The Naval Academy Band in Annapolis.

The Arundelair's had just won their Regional Contest in 1976. Needless to say I was very proud to join this wonderful group. At the time there were about 80 members. We prepared to go to London, England, for the International Contest in 1977. That year also I stopped biting my nails, stopped smoking and had another baby girl - six days before going to London. (I planned London first!). From then on she was known as the London baby. While in the Arundelairs, I joined a few quartets and competed. Quartet singing became my

The Backstage Coordinator duties include the following:

- Attend all RCSC meetings and site visits to work out the pattern for contestants
- Work with Competition Coordinator (CC) and Chair of Regional Convention (CRC)
- Work with the Assisting Chorus Chair (ACC) to let her know how many pattern workers are needed.
- Provide instructions to Assisting Chorus personnel who work the pattern
- Knowledge of Excel to track contestants as they go through the pattern, and making sure that they are given allotted time
- Work with hotel catering to order food for backstage workers
- Send letters out to Assisting Chorus personnel letting them know what times they need to meet for instructions
- Maintain a calm demeanor in order to handle emergency situations


